Ever wondered what happened in Oz before Dorothy dropped in to see the wizard?

You can follow the adventures of Glinda The Good and Wicked Witch of the West Elphaba in the Young Australian Broadway Chorus's production of *Wicked* this month.

Balaclava's Tristan Sicari and Elsternwick's Taylor Troeth will take centre stage in the show, at the National Theatre in St Kilda this month.

Both seasoned young performers, Sicari and Troeth are looking forward to treading the boards in the critically acclaimed musical.

Wicked tells the story of an unlikely friendship between the girls and how they ultimately fulfil their destinies as the good and bad witches of Oz.

After the success of last year's sellout production of Shrek the Musical, Wicked will be the Young Australian Broadway Chorus's most ambitious project to date, with a full orchestra, spectacular sets and costumes and an extraordinary cast of young performers aged between 10 and 21.

Wicked will be performed at the National Theatre until January 27.
